

# October Social Night

Despite the damp weather Scots Club members enjoyed a most pleasant evening of Scottish music provided by **Ros and Shayne Kerr**.

They used a variety of instruments—including a fiddle modelled on the Renaissance period instrument, a recorder, a resonating metal mandolin made in South Australia, and of course Shayne's saw.

Their music included music by Niel Gow, reported to be the best Scottish fiddler of the 18th century, such as 'Lament for the Death of His Second Wife'. Other tunes included those used by Robbie Burns for 'Ye Banks and Braes', and 'The Deil's Awa Wi' the Exciseman'.

'Over the Sea to Skye' played on the saw was quite memorable. Many of us then joined in some Scottish dancing called and encouraged by Ros.

It was also great to hear **scholarship winner Enya Price-Maggenis** give a short talk on her trip to Scotland. She really got around to many highland games being most successful in many of them. For example at the City of Inverness pre-championship she received two firsts, a second and a third, being placed first in Highland. She also received a first, second and two thirds and placing second in National. All in all a total of 24 placings and a perpetual trophy.

The trip gave her the opportunity to attend dance classes and private lessons. She also felt that she had made lifelong friends from Scotland, Canada and Ireland.

Of course she finished her presentation with the dance with which she gained first prize

She expressed her real appreciation for the assistance Hunter Valley Scots Club was able to give.
